

JOHN F. BOVENZI

Chief Executive Officer of IndyMac Federal Bank &
Chief Operating Officer of the Federal Deposit
Insurance Corporation (FDIC)



John F. Bovenzi is the Chief Executive Officer at IndyMac Federal Bank. He was appointed to this position on July 11th of this year after the former IndyMac Bank was closed and then reopened under ownership by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). Mr. Bovenzi is serving in this role until the bank is returned into the private sector. Prior to this appointment, Mr. Bovenzi was the Chief Operating Officer at the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, a position he has held since 1999. In that role he serves as a principal advisor to the Chairman of the FDIC and directs the day-to-day operations at the Corporation.

Mr. Bovenzi was the Director of the FDIC's Division of Resolutions and Receiverships from 1993 through 1999. In that position he oversaw the FDIC's bank closing and receivership management activities. Prior to that, Mr. Bovenzi served as the Deputy to the Chairman of the FDIC and the Resolution Trust Corporation (RTC) from 1989 through 1992. He was the Deputy Director of the FDIC's Division of Research and Statistics between 1987 and 1989. Mr. Bovenzi joined the FDIC in 1981 as a financial economist. He holds a BA degree in economics from the University of Massachusetts, and MA and Ph.D. degrees in economics from Clark University.
