Mr. Walker has a broad range of experience in economics, deposit insurance and financial supervision within the private, government and academic sectors. As Director of Policy and International Affairs at Canada Deposit Insurance Corporation ("CDIC"), he is responsible for assessing and developing public policies affecting the Corporation, conducting research on emerging financial sector policy issues, and coordinating CDIC's international activities.

Mr. Walker has been particularly active in helping countries develop and enhance their financial safety-net systems. He has worked with the Financial Stability Forum, the International Monetary Fund, World Bank, the Asian Development Bank and the South East Asian Central Bank Research and Training Centre (SEACEN). He has also provided advice and consulted with a number of countries including Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, Sweden, Thailand and the Ukraine. Mr. Walker is presently the Chair of the International Association of Deposit Insurers' ("IADI") Guidance Group which is responsible for the development of core principles and effective practices for deposit insurance systems.

Prior to joining CDIC in 1994, Mr. Walker was a senior economist with the Royal Bank of Canada. His responsibilities there ranged from macroeconomic forecasting to financial industry analysis and supervisory issues. Mr. Walker has an M.A. in Economics from McGill University and an M.B.A. in Finance from McGill and the University of Ottawa.
