The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (“FDIC”), having fully considered all the facts and information relating to the application filed pursuant to Section 19 of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act, (“Section 19”), 12 U.S.C. § 1829, by Travis D. Haymore (“Applicant”), individually, for a waiver of the FDIC policy requirement that an insured depository institution file a Section 19 application on his behalf, and for consent to participate directly or indirectly in the affairs of any insured depository institution, has determined that Applicant’s request for a waiver should be granted and that Applicant’s Section 19 application to participate in the affairs of any insured depository institution, should be approved, based upon the following:

- (1) Applicant pled guilty to a charge of misdemeanor grand theft under section 487(a) of the California Penal Code, Cal. Penal Code § 487(a). This is the only conviction subject to Section 19 and covered by this application.

(2) The FDIC notes that more than four years have elapsed since the conviction, and Applicant has had no further program entries or convictions subject to Section 19.

(3) Applicant seeks to work in the banking industry and requests that the FDIC waive its policy requiring that a sponsoring insured depository institution submit a Section 19 application on his behalf to enable Applicant to pursue employment with any insured depository institution.

(4) The FDIC has determined that Applicant has demonstrated satisfactory evidence of rehabilitation.

(5) The FDIC believes that Applicant's participation directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution, in any position, does not appear to constitute a threat to the safety and soundness of any other insured depository institution, or to the interests of depositors, and that such participation would not threaten to impair public confidence in any insured institution.

(6) The FDIC has determined that the FDIC policy requirement that an insured depository institution file a Section 19 application on Applicant's behalf should be waived.

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Travis D. Haymore, as an individual, shall be permitted to file the Section 19 application submitted with respect to any insured depository institution, without requiring that the insured depository institution file such an application on Applicant's behalf; and
