In Partnership With Barnstable County Correctional Facility

The Barnstable County Correctional Facility (BCCF) in Bourne began operations over a decade ago. The emphasis at the facility is on treatment and reentry services. BCCF has a well established residential substance abuse program (RSAP) and has been recognized by the Bureau of Justice Assistance as a model for other facilities.

Focus Groups

- Asked the essential question to develop the curriculum

“What would you like to know and understand about personal finance upon your release from the facility?”

Topics

- Establishing a Relationship With a Financial Institution
- Goal Setting
- Savings and Budgeting Strategies
- Opening and Managing a Checking Account
- The Responsible Use of Credit and Rebuilding One's Credit



Logistics

- Background checks on Bank personnel
- No staples, no elastics; all materials inspected
- Pencils need to be counted and collected
- No technology without prior approval by facility officials
- Tools needed for each class approved, scanned and left at facility



Resources

- FDIC Money Smart Curriculum
 - Flexibility of curriculum
- Custom designed lesson plans and activities
- Bank personnel
- Partnership with facility teachers and staff



Certificate Program

- Inmates must successfully complete all four classes
 - Active participation
 - Work cooperatively in groups
 - Complete any assignments before next class
- If successful, the inmate may open a checking and savings account at any Cape Cod Five Branch upon their release, with proper identification


