They are the ones with the first eyes on the check and should be better vetting their customers. Since all checks are now electronically scanned and signatures not being looked at the clearing bank will not have any way of knowing a check is fraudulent until the customer notices it when they get their statement at which time the scammer will have already taken out the money. We currently have a situation where Wells Fargo is refusing to credit us back the amount stolen by their customer. My understanding is the big banks are getting away with this because it would not be worth the expense of hiring an attorney to fight them.
