

**Meeting Between Staff of the Federal Reserve System, Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, and Representatives of the American Bankers Association, Capital One Bank, JPMorgan Chase Bank, and Webster Bank**

**Summary:** Staff of the Federal Reserve System, Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (collectively, the “agencies”) met with representatives of the American Bankers Association and three financial institutions (collectively, the “ABA”) regarding the agencies’ notice of proposed rulemaking and comment request entitled “Tax Allocation Agreements” (FDIC RIN 3064–AF62) (the “proposed rule”), which was published in the Federal Register on May 10, 2021 (86 Fed. Reg. 24755). In addition to topics included in its comment letter to the agencies regarding the proposed rule, ABA representatives discussed possible holding company implications of the proposed rule.
