Re: Prohibition under Section 19 of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act

Dear Ms. Willibey:

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) has become aware of your June 12, 2023 fraud conviction in LaGrange County, Indiana, that is covered by Section 19 of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act (FDI Act). Section 19 prohibits, except with the prior written consent of the FDIC, any person who has been convicted of any criminal offense involving dishonesty, breach of trust, or money laundering, or who has agreed to enter into a pretrial diversion or similar program in connection with a prosecution for such an offense, from becoming or continuing as an institution-affiliated party with respect to any insured depository institution; owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, any insured depository institution; or otherwise participating, directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution. Section 19 provides exceptions and exemptions for certain offenses that would otherwise be covered by the statute. Your offense referenced above does not currently meet the exception or exemption criteria. Because Section 19 is effective by operation of law, you are already subject to the law's restrictions, including the prohibition on participation in the affairs of any insured depository institution.

Pursuant to Section 19 of the FDI Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1829, because you were 21 years old at the time the offense occurred, your prohibition will expire 30 months after your sentencing occurred. Your attention is directed to Section 19(b) of the FDI Act, which imposes criminal penalties of up to five years' imprisonment and a fine of up to \$1,000,000 for each day such prohibition is violated, upon any person who knowingly violates the restrictions of Section 19.

If you have reason to believe that your June 12, 2023 conviction is not covered by Section 19 of the FDI Act, please provide a written response to this office within 30 days of your receipt of this letter by certified mail. After that time period, this letter will be posted and become publicly available on the FDIC website and will remain on the FDIC website until the criminal offense referenced above is no longer covered under Section 19.
